Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) The vast majority of HEERF funds will be distributed

The vast majority of HEERF funds will be distributed following Title IV qualifications, along with dollars for the Higher Education Act (HEA)'s Historically Black Colleges and Universities and Minority-Serving Institution programs, emergency student-grant aid at for-profit institutions of higher education, and minimal discretionary funding



Head Start/Early Education Programs

Funding will be distributed among existing federal programs that support the care and education of young children & families, including a majority for the Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) Program, followed by dollars for Head Start programs to respond to the needs of children and families.



Certified Community Health Clinics/Mental Health & Substance Abuse Programs

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services
Administration SAMHSA has distributed grants to increase
access to and to improve the quality of community mental and
substance use disorder (SUD) treatment services through the
expansion of Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics
(CCBHC)










Also Available: Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER)

The COVID Relief Packages are distributed with the purpose of...

- Improving coordination of efforts among state, local, tribal and other entities to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19
- Planning for and coordinating during long-term closures – including the purchase of hardware and software to support remote and hybrid learning
- Addressing the specific needs of disadvantaged students including those with learning loss through evidence-based approaches
- Providing services to support student mental health
- Supporting afterschool and summer learning programs
- Training staff on proper sanitization methods and personal protective equipment (PPE) usage
- Supplementing activities authorized under existing federal education laws (largely through Title I/ ESSA and Title IV Higher Education Funding Specifications)
